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## FULL SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE FOR NYS RESIDENTS TO TRAIN ONLINE TO BE CREDENTIALED ALCOHOLISM AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE COUNSELORS (CASAC)

The Outreach Training Institute (OTI), which provides licensing education for those studying to be addiction counselors, has received a grant from the New York State Office of Addiction and Supports (OASAS) to offer full Credentialed Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Counselor (CASAC) scholarships to qualified individuals throughout New York State.

The grant will fund \$400,000 in scholarships over two years, beginning in October 2023, and will fully support almost 70 students completing the entire Credentialed Alcohol and Substance Abuse Counselor curriculum online.

"This funding is critical, as there is a severe workforce shortage in the substance abuse treatment field," said Debra Pantin, President and CEO of Outreach. "At a time when the opioid crisis is worsening, the field is in dire need of credentialed counselors to help people with addiction navigate their way to recovery. These scholarships will help enormously."

Applications are currently being accepted (<u>link here</u>). The criteria for the scholarships will include a demonstrated interest and passion for helping people, with a concerted focus on recruiting those new to the profession. Eligible individuals



may work in human and social service agencies, or at other health facilities. They may also be involved in volunteer work in their communities and/or religious, civic, or cultural institutions. Individuals in recovery or family members affected by substance misuse or mental health disorder should also consider applying. There will be a strategic focus on recruiting people of color and those who speak Spanish, to fill the need for a more diverse workforce that is representative of persons served.

Accepted applicants will take part in orientation followed by the 350-hour, will begin in October. The 350-hour program is delivered in 9 modules and takes approximately 11 months to complete and obtain the New York State CASAC-T licensing certificate. Classes will meet in three-hour sessions, three times per week via live video conference on Webex.

For students without experience in the SUD field, several additional services will be provided that will prepare them to work in the field by offering six (6) career preparation classes, vocational support, and internship and job placement assistance.
