OUTREACH WELCOMES A NEW CHIEF OPERATING OFFICER KRISTA WHITMAN

Outreach is proud to announce that Krista Whitman was promoted to the role of the agency's Chief Operating Officer in 2023. Krista has been in the field for over 20 years and has served in a variety of leadership capacities at Outreach over the past decade. As COO, she oversees all day-to-day operations of the agency's programming, staff, IT, maintenance, and facilities.

Prior to being named COO, Krista served as Vice President of Outpatient Services where she managed daily operations, program development, and clinical culture of Outreach's outpatient clinics, ensuring compliance with all OASAS and OMH regulations as well as to the agency's high level quality standards. She also serves as a leader on our Justice, Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion Committee as the organization's LGBTQIA+ Coordinator.

As Program Director of Outreach's Outpatient Services at Suffolk Avenue in Brentwood, Long Island, Krista assisted in the development of specialized treatment services for women and the expansion of programming for Spanish-speaking clients. Additionally, she helped create a new forensic track to reduce substance use and criminal recidivism among clients who were formerly incarcerated.

Prior to joining Outreach, she spent 10 years with the Pederson-Krag Center where she was responsible for overseeing two Addiction Recovery Services departments and developing comprehensive services for the co-occurring substance use and mental health population. Krista also worked as a Coordinator of the Suffolk County Re-Entry Task Force, where she helped provide service linkages to new parolees and engaged state and local partners to provide benefits, services, and community-level support.

Krista is a member of the Suffolk County Re-Entry Task Force, and the Suffolk County Criminal Justice Addiction Workgroup. She received her Master of Social Work from SUNY at Stony Brook. In 2022, the Coalition of Black Trade Unionists honored her with their Community Service Award. In 2024, she will complete an MBA in Health Administration at SUNY Oswego.

DE B DIVERSITY EQUITY INCLUSION BELONGING

Diversity and Cultural Competence have been at the heart of Outreach's mission, programs, and services since its founding nearly 45 years ago. Furthering our commitment to these principles, and in response to calls to action with regards to ongoing racial injustice in our nation, Outreach has developed an agency-wide plan for DEIB (aka Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Belonging). This plan is guided by the National **Culturally and Linguistically Appropriate** Standards, led by our Chief Diversity Officer, Alexis Gadsden, our staff-led Justice, Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion (JEDI) Committee, and with ongoing input from our executive team, Board of Directors, and clients. The goal of the plan is to advance the agency's equity outcomes and ensure that Outreach continues to be an inclusive and equitable place for all cultures, indigenous groups, LGBTQIA+ and other underrepresented individuals, families, and staff. Toward this goal, in 2023, several DEIB initiatives were put into place.

- Implementing the OASAS language plan
- Providing free translation services in over 200+ languages at all clinical facilities
- Translating the agency website, opiny.org, into Spanish and Polish
- Offering patient surveys in 3 languages, most commonly used by our clients
- Posting signage throughout our facilities in multiple languages to let clients and their families know that they are welcome here and that their health and safety are important to us.





Program Highlights & Accomplishments

NEW OPIOID TREATMENT PROGRAM OPENED & ACCREDITED BY CARF

The new Integrated Opioid Treatment Program (OTP) opened in February 2023 at The Outreach Recovery Center in Brentwood, NY. The OTP provides medication assisted treatment services six days a week, filling a critical need on Long Island and the NYC metro area. As a truly integrated facility, the OTP provides numerous functions, assessments, methadone maintenance, clinical counseling, psychiatric evaluations, peer services, case management, and vocational assessments and counseling. Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF) International has awarded the OTP a Three-Year Accreditation following a rigorous peer-review process and demonstration of its commitment to offering services that are measurable, accountable, and of the highest quality.



YOUNG ADULT RESIDENCE MOVING FORWARD!

In 2023, Outreach took many steps forward with the construction and development of our new Young Adult Residence in Brentwood, Long Island. This new state-of-the-art residence will offer young adults from 18-25 years of age, intensive residential care. In keeping with Outreach's long history of assisting young people, this new program will combine a supportive living environment for residents with unique services for young adults, a much-overlooked population, helping them to re-establish healthy living, and reunite with their families.

RICHMOND HILL CERTIFIED COMMUNITY BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CLINIC AWARDED NYS GRANT & DESIGNATION

The NYS Office of Mental Health (OMH) and Office of Addiction Services and Supports (OASAS) have awarded funds to help Outreach provide comprehensive integrated medical and behavioral health care to children, families, and adults in Western Queens, New York. With this support, our Richmond Hill Wellness Clinic will be designated a Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic (CCBHC) and expand the scope of services for the neighboring community.

Program Highlights & Accomplishments

NEW SUPPORTIVE CRISIS STABILIZATION CENTER FOR LONG ISLAND

OMH and OASAS awarded Outreach a contract to open a new Supportive Crisis Stabilization Center (SCSC) in eastern Suffolk County, where there is a dearth of crisis services especially for low-income and marginalized communities. This new walk-in facility will be open 24/7, 365 days a year for anyone (youth, adults, and families) feeling overwhelmed by mental health, substance use, or other life issues as emotional distress, anxiety, depression, family issues, addiction and/or intoxication. Services will be 100% voluntary, and no one will ever be turned away, regardless of their insurance status or ability to pay.

NEW MOBILE STREET OUTREACH PROGRAM FOR LONG ISLAND

OASAS awarded a \$325,000 grant so we can develop a mobile Street Outreach Program in Nassau and Suffolk Counties, that will be staffed by licensed peers who will connect with the region's most vulnerable and underserved individuals by bringing services and supports to where they are.

WORKFORCE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS FOR SUFFOLK COUNTY AND NYS PROFESSIONALS

With support from the Suffolk County Opioid Settlement Funds and the NYS Office of Addiction Services and Supports (OASAS), the Outreach Training Institute (OTI) developed two new scholarship programs -- the Suffolk County Workforce Scholarship Program and the NYS Addiction Professionals Scholarship Program -- to help fill an urgent need for substance use counselors in the State. These programs offer interested individuals and seasoned professionals, 200 from Suffolk County and 50 individuals from other parts of State, free tuition to attend OTI's 350-hour training to become Certificate Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Counselors (CASAC). For those who are new to the field, additional opportunities are provided to help prepare them launch their careers, including career preparation classes, paid internships and internship supervision, job placement assistance, and CASAC exam preparation classes.

Program Highlights & Accomplishments

PARTNERSHIP TO INCREASE ACCESS TO CARE IN QUEENS







Outreach became part of a dynamic new partnership with two other notable Queens-based prevention, treatment, and recovery providers, Elmcor and Phoenix House, to expand access to care for people living in the borough. The goal of the Queens Providers Network is to ensure that residents have the resources they need to address substance use and other co-occurring mental health disorders, including behavioral health therapies and supports to meet their needs such as housing, employment, clothing, and food, as well as free transportation to and from their appointments, which is often a significant barrier to accessing care.

NEW EQUINE THERAPY PROGRAM FOR ADOLESCENTS

With financial support from the town of Babylon, we were able to offer our residents at Outreach House II residence for adolescents in Brentwood, Long Island the opportunity to engage in an equine-assisted psychotherapy program. Research has shown that working therapeutically with horses has multiple benefits for young people including increased self-confidence, self-efficacy, and communication. To prepare for the introduction of this new therapy, staff received training from our program partners and the equine specialists at Pal-O-Mine in Islandia, NY.



NEW STAFF WELLNESS INITIATIVES

Outreach is committed to building healthy lives, including for our staff. According to the CDC, healthy employees have a better quality of life, lower risk of disease, illness, and injury, as well as increased work productivity and a greater likelihood of giving back to their communities. To make sure that our staff feels well cared for and has opportunities to address their own health, the agency initiated a series of wellness activities including the 2023 Cigna Fitness Challenge, free registration to participate in the annual John Brower, Jr. Heroes for Heroin Walk, a Zumba class, free massages, an aromatherapy workshop, and gift cards for participating





We never meet,


but we are together.


